PREPAREDNESS, CIRCULAR 302.12

TRAINING OUTLINE FOR HOURLY FIREFIGHTERS AND COOPERATORS

SCOPE

All hourly wildland firefighters and Cooperators hired after January 1, 1989 are required to meet minimum standards of training. These standards include position qualification (see **Circular 302.10 – Wildfire Position Training Standards**) and other agency specific training as outlined by title by the Division of Personnel (Position Classification Questionnaire Form DPF-44).

DEFINITION

Cooperator – An agency, or a person who works primarily for another agency, that is contracted to provide emergency services in support of a wildland fire. The specific personnel and equipment contracted are directly under the command of the Forest Fire Service, and as such, must meet the same standards and qualifications as required.

Hourly Employee - A person who works for the agency less than the established full-time normal schedule of hours per day or days per week and is paid through the “fireline payroll” (form PDF-160, Fire Bill)

POLICY

Completion of an hourly employee “payroll forms package” is required for all new Forest Fire Service Crewmembers prior to receiving initial training.

Qualifications may be based on recognized classroom, “hands on” or computer or internet instruction when properly documented and all pre-requisites are met. Crosswalks exist that list certain, discipline specific courses that may be substituted towards another discipline’s certification. These crosswalks need to be checked to ensure applicability. However, it is ultimately the competencies and behaviors evaluated in the task books that establish qualification for wildland firefighter positions.

Any person hired or appointed to a title listed below shall meet the following minimum qualifications;

1. Crewman* –
 - a) Must meet NWCG standards for Wildland Firefighter Type 2.

2. Deputy District Warden –
 - a) Must meet NWCG standards for a Wildland Firefighter Type 1.
 - b) Must meet NWCG standards for Incident Commander Type V

* Firefighters hired before January 1, 1989 are grandfathered in as a Wildland Firefighter Type 2.

3. *District Warden (with annual salary) –*
 - a) Must meet NWCG standards for Single Resource Boss
 - b) Must be qualified as Firing Boss (FIRB)
 - c) Must meet NWCG standards for Incident Commander Type IV.
 - d) District Warden In-service Training

4. *Cooperators –*
 - a) individual Cooperators shall be minimally qualified as a Wildland Firefighter Type 2.
 - b) When contracted as a single resource such as an engine or dozer, at least one qualified Single Resource Boss must be assigned for the type of equipment contracted.

Additionally, personnel must receive an endorsement indicating that they have been provided training by the kind and type of equipment for which they are operators.

Recommended, but not required, training for all positions include:

- S-211 – Portable Pumps and Water Use
- S-212 – Wildfire Power Saws
- Off Road Wildland Engine Operations
- Dozer/Tractor-Plow Equipment Operator
- Fire Protection Operations in the Wildland/Urban Interface
- FI-110 Wildland Fire Observations and Origin Scene Protection for First Responders
- Basic First Aid and CPR
- ATV Operator
